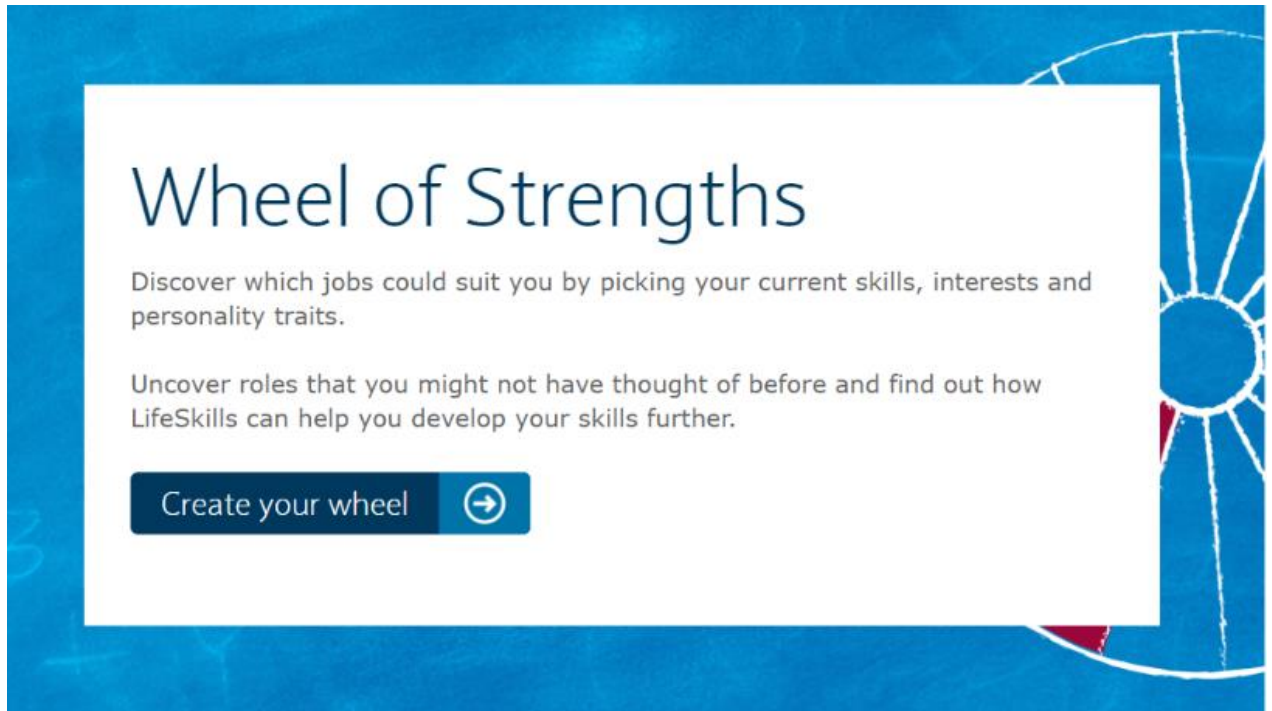
2. Then click on Register

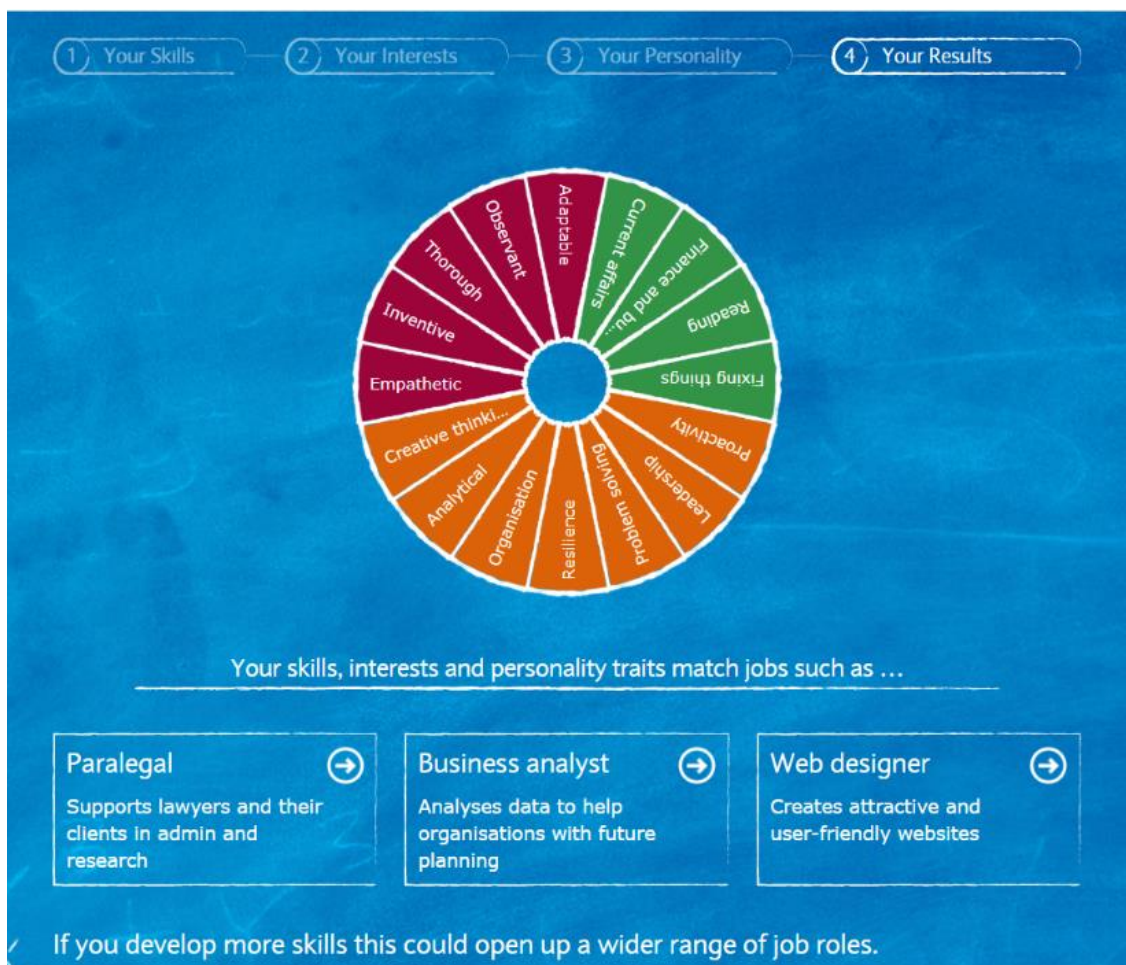
3. Under Register for Free select Young Person. Fill in the details required and click on Next. I'd suggest using your school email and password.

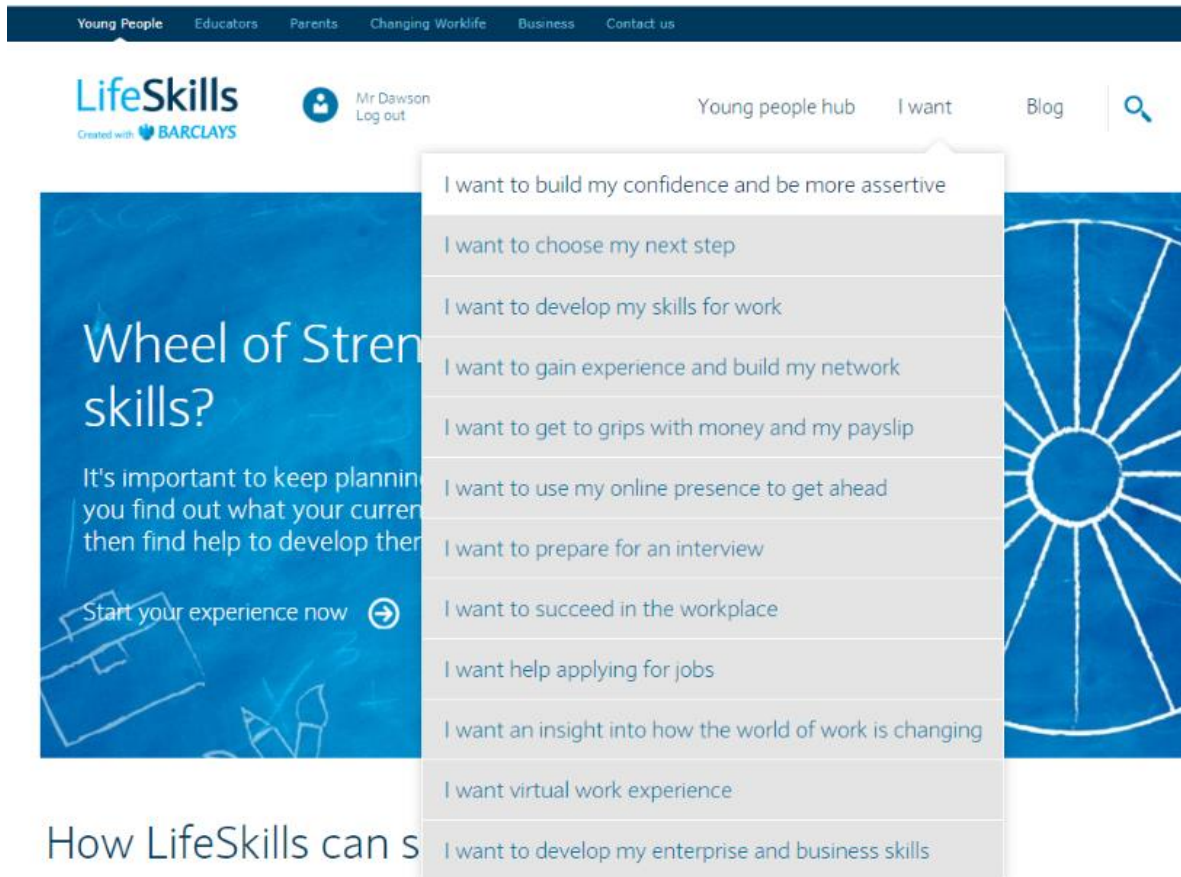
4. Use the Wheel of Strengths resource to help determine what kinds of jobs could suit your current skills interests and personality traits.
