- Record themselves speaking out loud and listen back to it to self-assess
- Practise the role play and photo card using the examples on MS Teams
- Practise vocabulary by using the Knowledge Organiser, Quizlet and the [AQA specification vocabulary](#)

- Quiz them on the General Conversation questions and the [AQA specification vocabulary](#)
- Encourage them to practise little and often
- Encourage attendance at the revision sessions
