Dear Parent/Carer

I hope this letter finds you and your families well.

I am writing to you today to summarise our current developments with Year 11 and highlight future dates for your diary.

Study Period Schedule

Last week was the first week of our Study Period Progress Provision, where students started their half-termly subject sessions during mentor time on Wednesday and Thursday. I visited Study Period on Wednesday to see how students had settled in and was impressed by the level of focus and diligence demonstrated by Year 11 students. I hope that students continue to benefit from these sessions as, in total, they are equivalent to one extra lesson each week in one of their priority subjects. As a reminder, I have included the Study Period schedule for Year 11 below:

Weekly assemblies

Year 11 receive an assembly each week that focuses on a specific theme relevant to them, such as maintaining a growth mindset, choosing a suitable career path, and understanding good habits. These are an excellent opportunity for students to hear from different members of staff about their experiences. Please check in with your son/daughter on what they've learned during the weekly assembly to see how it is relevant to their future.

After-school revision sessions

This week will be the first week of our after-school revision sessions for students. Whilst this is not a compulsory period 7, your feedback in our survey towards the end of last year highlighted how keen students were to attend extra sessions run by subject specialists. You should have received a letter with information on these sessions and how they will run. If you have any queries relating to these, please contact your son/daughter's mentor in the first instance.



<u>Attendance</u>

On their first day back at school, we spoke with students about the importance of their attendance and how it is a key component of academic success. It is an expectation at The Garibaldi School that students attend 100% of the time. We have the belief that every missed session is a missed opportunity for students.
