## Dear Parent /Carer

As a part of your child's education at The Garibaldi School, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education programme; this is known as Personal Development at The Garibaldi School. Personal Development is the curriculum subject that gives young people the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

A key element of our Personal Development curriculum is Relationships and Sex Education (RSE). From September 2020 the Government has made its delivery mandatory as part of statutory guidance. Parents and carers do have the right to withdraw students from RSE sessions, where alternative provision will be provided for those students on other aspects of Personal Development. At The Garibaldi School RSE lessons are delivered from Year 7 all the way through to Sixth Form, and will include teaching age-appropriate topics about:

- **Year 7:** Healthy relationships, private parts of the body, friendships, staying safe online, family dynamics
- **Year 8:** Teenage family life, romantic relationships, marriage, contraception and male circumcision
- **Year 9:** Risks involved in sexual relationships, consent, HIV and AIDS, Female Genital Mutilation, LGBT, marriage breakdown and domestic abuse
- Year 10: Child Sexual Exploitation, Female Genital Mutilation, sexting and the law, different types of contraception, different STIs and their effects, teen pregnancy, Peer-on-peer abuse
- **Year 11:** Healthy Relationships, Sexual Health (recap), Female Genital Mutilation, Peer-on-peer abuse, Consent
- **Sixth Form:** Consent, STIs and contraception, the life changes involved in having children, sex and the law for 18 year old students, sexting, sex and the importance of age, pornography vs. real-life sex

Students will also have opportunities to ask questions that help prepare them for relationships of all kinds in the modern world. Personal Development is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body. All Personal Development teaching takes place in a safe learning environment, delivered by Mentors who know their Mentees as individuals, and is underpinned by our school ethos and values.

- 1. Our values of equality, inclusion and respect for all students and communities;
- 2. Age-appropriate information guided by external SRE professionals, as well as the consideration of maturity levels, their cultural and religious backgrounds;
- 3. Every students' learning needs including special educational needs
- 4. What students need to know in order to live healthy lives and stay safe in school, in their personal relationships and in the wider world.

We would like to invite you to take part in a Parent Consultation on our RSE curriculum. The consultation is your opportunity to withdraw your child from the sex module of Sex and Relationships. The consultation will open on **Monday 13th September**, **2021** and the deadline for responses is **Monday 27th September**, **2021**. We will consider responses to the consultation ahead of Sex and Relationships modules being delivered in Personal Development lessons.

As a school community, we are committed to working in partnership with parents; recent national parental feedback has indicated that the overwhelming majority of parents continue to be highly supportive of the relationships and sex education programme.
