Changes to Study Period

This year, we have changed our approach to Study Period. All year groups have Study Period at the start of their school day from Monday to Thursday. There is no Study Period on a Friday. Study Period also runs on a two-week timetable. For your reference, I have included a copy of the weekly Study Period timetable for Year 10:
